SUBJECT: Purchase of 30 Scott Regulators and 5 Scott SCBAs.

Recommendation

- 1.) That council approve a budget amendment for the following recommended purchases using CARES Act funds for respiratory protection and disease prevention. The below items are not currently included in the Fire Department budget.
- 2.) That council approve the recommendation to purchase 30 Scott Regulators in the amount of \$57,000 using CARES Act funds.
- 3.) That council approve the recommendation to purchase 5 Scott SCBA's for use by fire investigators and command staff in the amount of \$37,500 using CARES Act funds.

Summary

In FY22 the fire department purchased new Scott SCBA's that were put into service in January, 2022. We were not able to get the full compliment of gear to outfit all of our personnel with the project budget. Therefore, the below additions are being requested.

Purchase of 30 Scott regulators to allow each firefighter to have their own regulator. This will provide a control for disease prevention related to airborne illnesses. Currently regulators are shared and require regular disinfection between use.

Purchase of 5 Scott SCBA's that will be used by fire investigators and command staff while working in toxic environments during fire investigations and fire command duties.

Financial Considerations

\$94,500 in CARES Act funds for respiratory protection and disease prevention measures.
